Carmen Samuel Tiberio, a long-time resident of St. Augustine, Florida, passed away September 20, 2018 at age 91. He is survived by his loving wife Ursula, of St. Augustine; his daughter Jodi (Jeff) Stanch & grandchildren: Chelsea and Zachary Stanch, of Jacksonville, Florida and brother Nicholas (Philomena) of Poland, Ohio and many wonderful nephews, nieces, extended family and friends.

Carmen was born in Youngstown, Ohio, on April 7, 1927, to the late Christino and Speranza Menicillo Tiberio. He attended local schools and graduated from Gallaudet University in 1951. After teaching at the South Carolina School for the Deaf and Maryland School for the Deaf, relocated to St. Augustine, Florida in 1965 with wife Eloise and daughter Jodi, to teach graphic arts and printing at the Florida School for the Deaf - Vocational department, until his retirement. In 1989, he married Ursula Palka.

Carmen was also a leader and advocate in the deaf community, two-time President of the Florida Association of the Deaf & instrumental in the foundation of the Palms Club of the Deaf in St. Augustine. He was an active member of the Moose Lodge in St. Augustine. He impacted the lives of many through his teaching and is fondly remembered by many former students. He will be greatly missed.

He had a quick wit and enjoyed wood working, reading, furniture making, bowling, watching sports on TV and was quite the handy man around the house. In college, he ran cross country for Gallaudet, a sport both of his grandchildren participated in during their high school years. He was generous with his time and monetary gifts, supporting many worthwhile causes & events.
